Dear Parents

You would have all seen the fantastic new native garden and painting that welcomes you as you enter the school grounds and I need to thank Kellie Bruce and Mishael Peeradina who have been working on this project for over two years, including putting in the submission to fund the project, Merridith Hammat, MLA, Member for Mirrabooka, for the support that she has given Rawlinson Primary School and the funding of the project from the State Government, Sarah Weston, who designed our mural, supported by Bonnie Sutton and Gecko Contracting for doing the work.

It is going to be a tremendous place for us to sit, talk and enjoy nature, the birds in the trees and the plants as they grow. We have been emphasising to the students that this is a special place, not a playground to run around in but one to sit, talk and enjoy. New Social Media Restrictions

FROM DECEMBER 10, 2025

NEW LAWS WILL PREVENT SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORMS FROM ALLOWING AUSTRALIANS UNDER 16 TO CREATE OR KEEP ACCOUNTS.

THIS CHANGE AIMS TO PROTECT YOUNG PEOPLE FROM EXCESSIVE SCREEN TIME AND EXPOSURE TO HARMFUL CONTENT.



What's changing for children under 16?

Platforms affected include Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, TikTok, X, YouTube, and others.

Under-16s can still view public content and use messaging/gaming apps, educational platforms, and health services.

Accounts may be deactivated (not deleted), but it's best to download important content before the deadline.

Ryker: My report is on Great White sharks. They are fish and they may look scary but they are not, as long you don't get too close.






Our Year 5 Students have been learning to write persuasive texts.

How To Keep Your Child Safe Online

Protecting your children from harm is just as important online as it is in the real world. As a parent or carer, you can play an important role in helping children have safe and positive experiences online.

The internet offers an exciting world of experiences for children and the whole family. It can be entertaining, educational and rewarding. However, using the internet also involves risks and challenges.

Children might be exposed to content that is sexually explicit, violent, prohibited or even illegal. They may also experience cyber bullying or be at risk from contact by strangers.

Children may - unknowingly or deliberately - share personal information without realising they may be subject to identity theft, or that they are leaving behind content that might not reflect well on them in the future.

By taking an active role in talking with your kids about the risks and answering their questions or concerns about something that they find on the Internet you can help them stay safer online.
