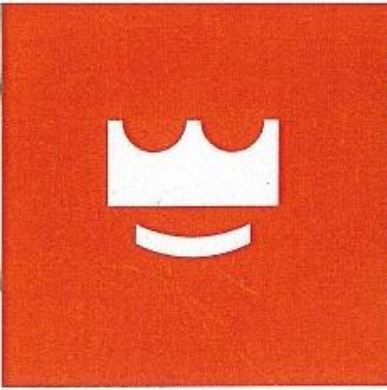

Bike Safety - tips for Children

Riding a bike is great fun and good exercise for your child.

Here are a few tips to keep your child safe while cycling:

- Children under 10 need supervision when riding a bike.
- Teaching road rules to your child is important for safe practices.
- A footpath or shared path is the best place to cycle unless a no bicycles sign is displayed. Riding in the driveway should be discouraged.
- When crossing a road, teach your child to stop before entering the road, look in all directions, listen and think about when it is safe to cross the road.
- Every child needs a helmet that fits correctly. Helmets should be always worn when riding. Parents can set a good example by wearing a helmet themselves.
- Children's bicycles should be kept in good condition and have the appropriate reflectors.
- Wearing bright coloured clothing increases visibility to others on the road.
